The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO) Denver Field Office and the Office of Acquisition Management (OAQ) Detention, Compliance and Removals Division (DCR) proposes to extend Contract HSCEDM-11-D-00003 on a basis of other than full and open competition.

### 2. Nature and/or Description of the Action Being Approved

- (a) Type of action: Extension of Firm Fixed Price (FFP) Indefinite Delivery Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) Surge Contract Line Item Number (CLIN) under Contract HSCEDM-11-D-00003
- (b) Amount of Current J&A (b)(4) (Funds will be obligated under Task Orders)
- (c) Brief Description: OAQ has a requirement to continue, on a sole source basis, surge support for detention and transportation services at the Aurora Contract Detention Facility (CDF) in Aurora, Colorado.

## 4. Identification of Statutory Authority Permitting Other Than Full and Open Competition

The statutory authority permitting other than full and open competition is 41 U.S.C. § 3304 (a)(1), as implemented by FAR Subpart 6.302-1, Only One Responsible Source and No Other Supplies or Services Will Satisfy Agency Requirements.

### 5. Demonstration that the nature of the acquisition requires use of the authority cited.

GEO provides full time detention and transportation services at the Aurora Contract Detention Facility (CDF) in Aurora, Colorado for ICE detainees. Services include detention management, custodial supervision, case management, transfers to various areas of responsibility, foreign removals, premium medical care, onsite hearings and asylum services. Services are provided in compliance with the ICE 2011 Performance Based National Detention Standards (PBNDS 2011), American Correctional Association (ACA) Standards for Adult Local Detention Facilities (ALDF), Standards for Health Services in Jails, National Commission on Correctional Health Care (NCCHC), and other state and local laws on firearms.

GEO is currently the only source readily available that possess the requisite qualified facility and personnel that can provide detention, care, and removal services for approximately 432 ICE detainees within the Denver Area of Responsibility (AOR) in accordance with ICE standards. Delaying this extension would require ICE to relocate detainees to other AORs, some with serious medical conditions. Approval of the proposed extension ensures the uninterrupted continuity of services by allowing ICE to continue to detain, care for, and remove aliens within the Denver AOR.

## 6. Description of efforts made to ensure that offers are solicited from as many potential sources as is practicable.

County jails in the Denver AOR and industry service providers were contacted to gauge interest and availability from the market place; however, no interested party other than GEO was found that could provide services for 432 detainees at this time.

### 7. Determination by the Contracting Officer that the Anticipated Cost to the Government Will be Fair and Reasonable

The Contracting Officer has determined that the anticipated price will be fair and reasonable as the extension is based on historical and current pricing data. The Department of Labor Wage Determination (WD) will be incorporated as it covers the majority of the work performed under the contract.

### 8. Description of Market Research

The Denver Field Office solicited several private industry providers as well as the county jails that currently hold ICE detainees; however, GEO was the only vendor identified that could meet this immediate requirement.

10. A Listing of the Sources, if any, that expressed in writing an Interest in the Acquisition

GEO is the only source that expressed an interest in performing this immediate requirement.

11. A Statement of the Actions, if any, the Agency May Take to Remove or Overcome any Barriers to Competition before any Subsequent Acquisition for Supplies or Services Required

For future requirements of this type, ICE will once again conduct extensive market research to identify multiple sources for this requirement.


